How to Grow Strawberries at home

- Choose a location with well-draining soil and full of sun
- Plant on a cloudy day or in the late afternoon in the spring
- ► Use well-draining soil, plant crowns at soil level
- Water only roots to keep the plant dry, about twice weekly
- ► Apply a balanced fertilizer (10 -10 -10) when planting
- ► Watch for pests, and pick berries when fully red.

HOW DID OUR ROADS AND NEIGHBOURHOODS GET THEIR NAMES?

Ever wondered where the names of our local roads came from? Many of them have deep historical roots going back nearly a century.

It All Started in the 1930s

The story of how our roads and neighbourhoods were named begins in the 1930s, during a period of suburban development. As new housing estates were being planned and built, developers and town planners often looked to history, geography, and notable landowners for inspiration.

The Cotswold Connection

Many of our local streets such as Pebworth Road, Norval Road, Blockley Road, Littleton Road, Paxford Sudbury Court and Pebworth Estate 1939



Road, Ebrington Road, Draycott Avenue, and Ilmington Road—were named after villages and farms found on Captain Churchill's Cotswold Estate, located at Northwick Park, Blockley in Gloucestershire.

This naming practice was a way to bring a sense of charm, heritage, and rural character to the newly developed areas. These Cotswold names not only added a touch of the English countryside to urban life but also reflected connections between the landowners and developers of the time.
